## Cemetery Trustees Meeting Tuesday April 6, 2021 5:30 PM

## Highland Cemetery Minutes

Present: Jay Cary, Laurie Wadsworth, Trustees; Blake Allison & Matt Stevens, Conservation Commission; Sean Norton of Sean's Lawn & Garden, Orford; Jean Smith, former Cemetery Trustee

- 1. March Minutes APPROVED
- 2. All present <u>walked through the cemetery</u>, pointing out areas in need of Sean's attention if he is willing:
  - "Screening" between the cemetery and the Transfer Station. Blake and Matt had brought a list of NH native plants, which we unanimously agreed would be most preferred. Laurie also encouraged possible use of butterfly/pollinator friendly plants and several possibilities were discussed.
  - Several examples of older foliage which is overgrown and either unsightly or a threat to nearby gravestones. One of the worst examples is the grave of Clayton Claflin, which has been obscured by bushes around it.
  - Jean Smith gave Sean an overview and history of the Memorial Garden, along with the original plan, which was made when she was a Cemetery Commissioner. Several of these plantings need either pruning or feeding.
  - Jean also walked us along the western border, above Route 10, including a nice grouping of lilacs.
  - We considered possibilities for the eastern border in front of the shed where deer have chewed on former plantings. One possibility is the planting of a small deciduous tree along the driveway into the shed as a distraction instead of trying to revive the border plantings.
  - Sean pointed out that this year in particular, nursery supplies are low. We agreed that if he is hired for long-term, he can come up with a multi-year plan which would enable him to reserve some plantings each winter when the prices are best.
    - Sean also noted that he does not do watering.
- 3. After the others left, Jay and Laurie agreed to recommend hiring Sean. Laurie will notify Dina to find out the next steps.
- 4. Due to the impending darkness, we ran out of time to go over the revised Cemetery Rules and Regulations; additionally we both want Michael Hinsley's input when he is available, after the COVID epidemic recedes and frees him up.
- 5. Meeting adjourned at 6:50 PM.
