The Town buildings are open to the public following the lapse of Governor Sununu's Emergency Orders. The Town is following CDC guidance on masking and distancing. The Board will be meeting via Zoom and in person. The location of the meeting is 1 High Street, the Town Office conference room. If you come to this location you must wear a mask when entering the building and while in the conference room.

- 1. At 9:05AM Mrs. Brotman opened the meeting.
- 2. Mr. Kahn moved to approve the minutes from the meeting on October 7th, 2021. Mrs. Brotman seconded the motion. Voted unanimously by roll call vote.
- 3. The Board reviewed a Report of Woodcut. Mr. Kahn moved to approve the Report of Woodcut. Mrs. Brotman seconded the motion. Voted unanimously by roll call vote.
- 4. Road Agent, Scott Bailey and Police Chief, Shaun O'Keefe discussed the gates to be installed at the section of old River Road that is now a Class A trail:
 - ✓ Chief O'Keefe reported that he has had a conversation with a property owner about their property line.
 - ✓ Chief O'Keefe measured and marked where he thinks it would be appropriate to put the north end gate. It may be more challenging to find a good placement for the gate on the South end, because there will be a gap large enough for a vehicle

- to get through even with the gate in place. Chief O'Keefe believes if we remove the Jersey Barriers from the other side of the road and use those to fill the gap it would prevent the public from entering with vehicles.
- ✓ The gate will be closed but not be locked. If the public does not respect the regulations of the trail then we will have to revisit the topic of locking the gates.
- ✓ A letter will be drafted to send to property owners affected by the placement of the gates.
- ✓ A fence may need to be installed to delineate this trail. This will make it clear to walkers and bikers where the trail is.
- 5. Mr. Bailey and the highway department will need to do an emergency tree removal on Goose Pond Road tomorrow, October 22nd, 2021.
- 6. Todd Haywood, the town assessor, updated the Board on the revaluation and gave an explanation of the process:
 - ✓ There was a \$59,728,000 increase to the Town valuation, which is a 15.3% increase.
 - ✓ There were 61 sales from April 2019 through September 2021.
 - ✓ The equalization ratio is now 98%.
 - ✓ The Board is going to review the documentation Mr. Haywood provided and they are feeling comfortable with the progress and he can continue to move forward.
 - \checkmark Residents have the opportunity to apply for an abatement any time following receipt of tax bills until March 1st.
 - ✓ See attached documentation for further information.
- 7. The Select Board will be having a Budget Workshop on Wednesday October 27th, 2021 at 1:00 PM followed by a non-public session concerning personnel.
- 8. The Board will approve the manifest electronically.
- 9. The Board acknowledged Mr. LaBombard's resignation with regret from the Sexton position. He has been Sexton for thirty-one years and the Board wants to express their appreciation for his many years of service to the Town of Lyme.
- 10. Mrs. Cutting reported that she received the final numbers for Health Insurance. The cost of health insurance has decreased 8.1% and dental has decreased 1.5%. While everything else stayed almost level. Those numbers will be reflected in the budget under 'benefits'.
- 11. The Board signed the list of 2021 tax exempt properties.
- 12. A group of students and a teacher at the Lyme School are learning about maple syrup making and would like to ask the Board for permission to tap a couple of maple trees on the small common. The Board is in full support of this project.
- 13. Mrs. Cutting received one mowing bid from Lyme Lawn Care LLC. Their bid totaled is \$49,500. Lyme Lawncare has mowed for the Town in the past and they have solid recommendations. Mr. Kahn moved to accept Lyme Lawn Care LLC bid of \$49,500 for mowing. Mrs. Brotman seconded the motion. Voted unanimously by roll call vote.

- 14. The CPI figure which is traditionally used for the cost of living increase to employee wages was noted to be 5.4% for September 2021. The Board has requested Mrs. Cutting calculate payroll and benefit based on this new %.
- 15. At 10:41 AM Mrs. Brotman moved to enter non-public session under RSA 91-A: 3 II (c) reputation. Mr. Kahn seconded the motion. Voted unanimously by roll call vote.
- 16. At 11:05 AM the Board returned to public session haven taken no votes during this non-public session.
- 17. At 11:06 Mr. Kahn moved to adjourn. Mrs. Brotman seconded the motion. Voted unanimously by roll call vote.
