

Q1 Are you registered to vote in Lyme?






Q4 . . . On the same day as the municipal elections (March 10), starting at 4:00 pm?


Q5 . . . On a different weekday in March evening starting at 4:00 pm?

Q6 . . . On a different weekday evening in March starting at 6:00 pm?




Q7 . . . On a Saturday morning in March, starting at 9:00 am?







The PTO just dissolves. Community involvement is important, and it's really great to put this out there in terms of finding a better solution for people.
